Year 13 Welcome and Key Information

It is a pleasure to welcome Year 13 students back to school after the summer break. We are proud of the way they committed to their learning during Year 12, and are excited about what they can go on to achieve this year.

This letter provides essential information about the arrangements for Year 13.

Year 13 Welcome Evening

We are holding a Welcome Evening for Year 13 parents and carers on Wednesday 13 September at 6.30pm. This event, hosted by the Sixth Form Team, will outline the key details for parents / carers to best to support a Year 13 student. There will be opportunities for people to ask questions during the event. The event will take place in the Forum.

Sixth Form mindset

Throughout Year 12 we have worked with students to develop the VI HGS mindset, framed around 5 elements: Vision, Impact, Habits, Growth, Service. The start of Year 13 provides an opportunity for students to reflect on their effectiveness as learners, and to dedicate themselves to becoming the best that they can be.

In this important year, it is crucial that students commit to <u>a minimum of 5 hours of independent study per subject, per week</u>. Students should focus their study time on activities that help to commit learning to long-term memory and which allow them to apply knowledge in a purposeful way. We support this in lessons and home learning, and through a structured programme of study tasks in each subject area, which are accessed via the Year 13 Study class on Showbie.

Progression and UCAS

Throughout Year 12, students engaged in a range of activities to help them to develop a vision for their future beyond the Sixth Form. The first term of Year 13 is an important period in applying for university courses and apprenticeships. Students can apply for both of these progression routes simultaneously, and we encourage them to consider all options open to them. Support is provided by their form tutor and the Sixth Form Team within school.

Students who apply to university will do so through an online UCAS process, overseen by the Sixth Form Team. Time in the summer term was dedicated to this, and students should have completed a first draft of their personal statement, and will be in the process of researching courses.

It is crucial that students make appropriate course choices in line with their academic progress and Teacher Estimated Grades, and which match their personal preferences. The following steps will be taken to support this decision-making process:

- Students will shortly receive their UCAS predicted grades. These grades are included on university applications, and they represent aspirational grades which teachers believe a student has a realistic chance of being able to achieve.
- Weekly Progression sessions with form tutors during period 1 every Tuesday provide students with opportunities to explore and discuss their options.
- A personal statement clinic session will be held weekly on a Wednesday lunchtime for students to ask questions and seek advice.
- Specific support is available in school for students to discuss applications on a one-to-one basis with a member of staff. The school has a dedicated Student Adviser based in the Sixth Form who is available to discuss higher education options and career opportunities for all students. In addition, our independent Careers Adviser, Mrs Mitchell, will be available to meet Sixth Form students by appointment for careers advice. Conservatoire, Oxbridge, Medics, Dentists, Vets	2 October
Russell Group Universities	13 October
All other applications	10 November

Please be aware that numerous checks need to take place and an application can take up to three weeks to process in school, so the personal statement should be written as soon as possible. The dates are different due to earlier deadlines for Oxbridge, Medical and other comparable courses.

Sixth Form Standards

We set high standards in the Sixth Form and these expectations have been reiterated to students at the start of term. Full details of the routines and expectations can be found in the Sixth Form handbook. This includes a reminder that we insist on high standards of appearance and students are also issued with an ID badge and lanyard. This must be visibly worn at all times to help safeguard all members of our community. Details of the dress code can be found here. If students do not adhere to our dress code they will first be spoken to by a member of the Sixth Form Team. If students persistently fail to meet our expectations then parents / carers will be contacted.

Students have signed a Learning Agreement in which they have committed to upholding the standards outlined in this document. We ask that parents / carers also sign the electronic copy of the Sixth Form Learning Agreement

High levels of attendance in school and in lessons has a direct impact on positive academic outcomes in Year 13. We expect high levels of attendance throughout the academic year, and we will contact you if there is an unexplained absence. We monitor attendance trends closely and will put supportive measures in place if attendance falls below 97%. so that staff can be informed. Routine medical and dental appointments should be made outside school time.

Year 13 students are required to register at **8.50am** in their form room on a daily basis. Students are required to sign in and out at break and lunch times via our electronic inventory system. Where parents / carers have provided authorisation through the Learning Agreement, students will be granted home study if they have a free period at the end of the day.

Sixth Form Bursary

Students may apply for a bursary which aims to help and support students who face the greatest barriers to learning. Please note that students who received bursary payments last year must reapply for the new academic year.
