



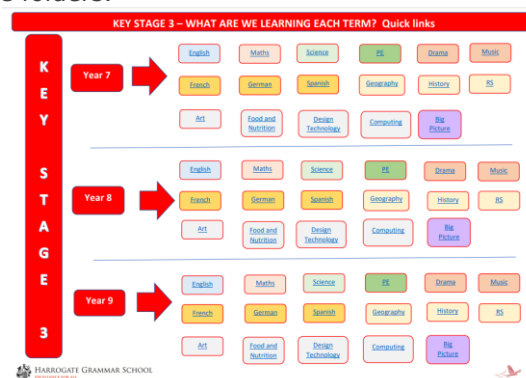

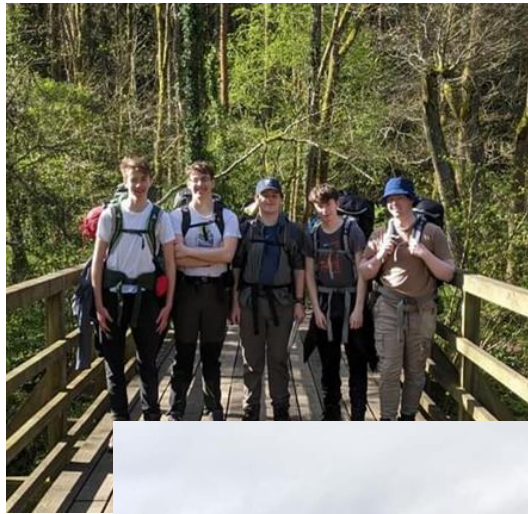

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Spotlight: World Earth Day, 22 April 2024

World Earth Day will take place on Monday 22 April focusing on the theme: **"Planet vs. Plastics"**. This encourages the commitment to end plastics for the sake of human and planetary health, demanding a **60% reduction** in the production of all plastics **by 2040** and an ultimate goal of building **plastic-free future for generations to come**.

This year's Earth day Goals are:

Goal 1

Promoting widespread public awareness of the damage done by plastics.

Goal 2

Rapidly phasing out all single use plastics by 2030.

Goal 3

Demanding policies ending the scourge of fast fashion.

What can you do to be more plastic-free?

- Use a re-usable water bottle
- Use a cloth bag rather than a plastic bag
- Choose plastic free-packaging
- Swap plastic straws for paper straws.

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Spotlight: The Jewish Festival of Passover



The Jewish Festival of Passover

Passover (or Pesach in Hebrew) is one of the most important festivals in the Jewish year. It is a Spring festival that begins on the 15th day of Nisan, the first month of the Jewish calendar. The celebrations last for seven or eight days, depending on where you live. In 2024, Passover begins on the evening of Monday 22 April and will end on Tuesday 30 April.

Passover is a celebration of the story of Exodus. During Passover, Jews remember how their ancestors left slavery behind them when they were led out of Egypt by Moses.

Passover Rituals

Passover is celebrated with a series of rituals. Each ritual symbolises a different part of the story.

On the evening before Passover starts, Jews have a special service called a Seder (order). This takes place over a meal with family and friends at home.



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
