Geography revision

We are committed to supporting our Sixth Form students achieve their very best in their studies and as we move towards the final exams we feel that students will benefit from having a structured revision tasks for Geography. Thus, as a department we have put together weekly revision resources for both human and physical content along with a timetable which can be found on the second page of this letter.

Our expectation is that all students will complete two revision worksheets a week, each one taking around an hour to complete. The revision worksheet requires pupils to write down everything they can remember about a topic from memory, then they can check their work using the student notes. If students missed any key information, then they need to write this onto the worksheet in green pen – this will outline to students' what areas require more revision. Once students have completed the revision worksheet they will be able to quiz their knowledge and understanding using a Socrative quiz. There will also be an exam question for students to plan linked to the topic they have revised.

The resources will be uploaded weekly into their Geography showbie class and the productivity of students will be checked by their class teacher. These resources have been planned using feedback from a student voice thus we hope that pupils engage fully with the tasks, but your support at home will be greatly appreciated.

We will continue to run the Monday revision sessions after school in S26 every week, and we will also be adding 'grade booster' sessions next half term.
