Did you know that there are 5 British Values?

British Value	What does this mean?
Democracy	how citizens can influence decision-making through the democratic process
The rule of law	how we appreciate that living under the rule of law protects individual citizens and is essential for their wellbeing and safety
Individual liberty	understand that the freedom to choose and hold other faiths and beliefs is protected in law
Mutual Respect	the importance of identifying and combating discrimination
Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs	accepting that other people have different faiths or beliefs to oneself (or have none), and should not be the cause of prejudicial or dissimilatory behaviour
