Exploring	Write an opinion article in the style of The Guardian's Comment is Free feature where you argue either for or against people speaking with regional accents. You will need to: Think of a headline Have a clear argument which should be clear throughout Include an introduction which engages and establishes your viewpoint Write at least 4 paragraphs with arguments to support your viewpoint Write a conclusion which does not repeat your introduction but DOES reinforce your view-point Include a range of techniques such as rhetorical questions, anecdotes, personal pronouns, emotive language, facts/statistics You can cite evidence from the articles that you have read and any research you do yourself We expect your writing to be typed and handed in on the first lesson. You should write no less than 1 side of A4 paper, 12pt font.
Reviewing	Be prepared to explain your opinion on regional accents, supported by the reading you have done, in your first lesson.
