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End of Academic Year Message – Summer 2024

As we approach the new academic year, we want to take this opportunity to not only wish you a pleasant summer break but also update you about some developments next year. We have much to celebrate over the 2023-2024 academic year.



This year, 80 trips took place involving nearly 10,000 student experiences. Students have travelled to many locations including Spain, Germany, France, Naples, Paris, London, Edinburgh, Cumbria, York, Wimbledon, multiple University trips, weekend trips to Condover Hall for netball and girls and boys football tournaments, both girls and boys rugby teams competed in the Rosslyn Park competition and the Year 8 cricket team completed a cricket tour in and around Liverpool. The annual End of Year trips to Flamingo Land and Bradford took place in July, as well as Geography and Biology students completing their fieldwork studies travelling to the Yorkshire coast, Malham, Otley and Leeds. 190 students across Year 10 and 12 have also completed the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze or Gold award expeditions.

There were 70 regular clubs and we played 400 sporting fixtures. In performing arts, over 900 students took part in a school play, concert, gig, theatre visit or workshop.

A total of 106,399 positives were given since January when we returned to Class Charts. There were 32 house events including English competitions, House Sports events, Sports Days, food bank collections and walk to school competitions.

In May, we wished our Year 11 and Year 13 all the very best in their final examinations. Year 11 were in Year 7 when the school closed due to the pandemic. We had a real focus this year on making sure they were ready for exams with many additional revision sessions before and during the exams, including Saturday School.

We would like to acknowledge the excellent conduct of all of our students who have taken external exams this year and hope their hard work is rewarded on the results days in the summer. Year 13 will receive their results in school on Thursday 15 August and Year 11 on Thursday 22 August. We wish students well and thank them for all their efforts.

School Priorities for next year

Next year we will continue our focus on returning attendance to pre-pandemic levels across the school. Whilst this is a national issue for all schools, we also face a challenge at HGS. This year we have introduced new initiatives, including more trips, clubs and attendance challenges. Our own data on the link between attendance and outcomes reminds us that the very best intervention strategy we have for children to do well in school is students, families and school, working together to keep attendance high.

In September we will deliver assemblies on our value of respect and ask students to commit to a respect pledge - to ourselves, others and our environment. We are keen to maintain the high expectations we have of behaviour and encourage students to show kindness each day in school. Further to this, we were very impressed with the work ethic in Year 11 and Year 13 this year and want to encourage this in all years through a focus on work ethic and student productivity.

This year we have been carrying out curriculum reviews in each subject area. This has involved a peer review process, working with headteachers, senior leaders and trained inspectors, in our Trust and wider, to refine our curriculum. This has been a rewarding process and helps us to develop even further as a school. One area of focus in our teaching next year, will be on the rigorous checking of understanding and teachers really inspiring and deepening student knowledge.





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Flexible Working Ambassador

In addition to our regional work in the Maths and Computing Hub, the school has been working regionally and nationally this year on a Department of Education initiative helping schools and Trusts to develop flexible working practices. The initiative involves the school acting as an ambassador and working with partner schools to improve flexible working. With the very real challenges of recruitment and retention in teaching, we are trying to innovate and pioneer new strategies, so we create the very best working environment for our staff.

Summer Work

Due to the sustained funding pressures in schools, we have a limited number of projects taking place over the summer. We have small projects taking place such as the redecoration and reconfiguration of some of the Art rooms and installing wall graphics in maths. Sadly, we had to postpone our work on new science labs in the Sixth Form. Luckily, however, our Wolfson Funding has been extended and we plan to do this work in the next academic year.

Next year we hope to refurbish our changing rooms because this is an area of school in need of development. We have been raising funds for this for a number of years and given the funding pressures on schools, we would welcome any ideas that you have around fundraising, knowledge about grants, benefactors, or alumni donations to help support this project. Catering Costs

Unfortunately, the pressure of food costs and catering mean that we need to increase our prices in September from the current ± 3.50 to ± 3.60 . In addition, our iPad repair charge has increased from ± 50 to ± 75 .

Year 13 Progression

Our students are celebrating success with offers from a wide range of universities, as well as apprenticeships and courses in art, music, drama and performing arts. 289 students applied to university which is 88% of the year group. Currently 53% of the applicants have accepted offers from Russell Group Universities to study a range of courses from History to Real Estate Management. It is fantastic to see the range of apprenticeships and degree apprenticeships undertaken by our Year 13 leavers increasing. Students are holding offers with companies across retail, marketing and business sectors. We would like to recognise the success of all our students on whatever their chosen pathway and wish them all the very best for their future. We are incredibly proud of our students and their achievements.



Year 12 Progression

We have been pleased with the work that our Year 12 students have done in developing their career ideas and planning for progression beyond the Sixth Form. Students embraced the opportunity to hear from a range of speakers, including 22 recent alumni, about universities, apprenticeships, gap years and careers. Students have all started the process of writing a personal statement for applications to university, apprenticeships or jobs, and they should take the opportunity to research courses over the summer using <u>Unifrog</u> and visit universities. When students return in September, they will be completing their applications to submit within the autumn term.



It is important that our students have a well-earned break over the summer to re-charge in anticipation of returning to school in September. There are many opportunities for students to continue their personal and academic development over this period which can be found on our website. These include the MOOC's, bridging materials and information regarding open days and progression.

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Year 13 A Level Results Day – Thursday 15 August

Many teachers will be present on Results Day to celebrate the success of students. In addition, a team of staff will be there to support students. This team will continue to support students over the following week until they have secured a progression route that meets their needs.

- Results can be collected from school at 9am in The Forum.
- Students are advised to check offers on UCAS TRACK as soon as possible; TRACK should be live from early Thursday morning.
- For Students in Clearing, staff will be available at school from 8am on Results Day to offer advice and to help guide students through the clearing process. Eligible students, identified by checking on UCAS TRACK, should come to room S09 so that they are well prepared and ready to access clearing vacancies as soon as they become available. Students are reminded to bring their log-in details so that we can fully support them. Full details of clearing places will be available on the UCAS website from Results Day on Thursday 15 August.

Year 11 GCSE Results Day – Thursday 22 August

Your exam results will be available for collection from 9am in the Forum on Thursday 22 August.

Please enter school via the Sixth Form reception. If you applied to HGS Sixth Form and have met the conditions of your offer, you will be requested to confirm your place and your subject choices with a member of the Sixth Form team, who will be located in the corridor outside the Forum. If you have not met the conditions of the offer, you should make an appointment with a member of the Sixth Form Team.

Our independent Careers Advisor will also be available to support students with any progression queries. Meetings with the Sixth Form team will take place on Friday 23 August. If you are unable to collect your results in person, they will be emailed to your student email address by noon that day. If you would like someone else to collect them on your behalf, please download and complete this form and hand it to the person collecting your results. They will need this completed form that is your written authorisation to collect your results on your behalf.

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France Trip - July 2024

This July, just over 120 of our year 7 students enjoyed a short visit to the Opal Coast, Northern France. After an early departure from school, they made it to Le Touquet in time for some early evening games on the beautiful sandy beach and sand dunes.

The itinerary the next day, included a snail farm, une biscuiterie, some time in the small town of Montreuilsur-Mer and a walk around Le Touquet. At the snail farm, the snail farmer showed the students around his farm and taught them all about snails before they got to sample some homemade garlic snails. At the biscuiterie, they learned how biscuits are made and also got to try something a bit sweeter than snails. After an interesting and busy day, they ate in a local restaurant before once again enjoying the beach.

Before heading back to Calais for the journey home, students were entertained at a French bakery, where they learned all about baguettes and croissants and had a go at rolling their own croissants. Thankfully, they were provided with some the baker had made earlier. A short but action-packed fun few days in France indeed.



German Trip - June 2024

We took 56 students (a mixture of year 8 and 9) to the Rhineland in Germany for 4 nights (25-29 June) Students thoroughly enjoyed the huge selection of buffet style food and then watching the football on the overnight ferry from Hull to Rotherdam. We arrived in Cologne in the early afternoon to a scorching 28 degrees. We experienced a relaxing but informative cruise along the river, followed by shopping time in Cologne and a look around the cathedral as well as plenty of photos in front of the striking piece of architecture.

The next day, we woke up early to go to Phantasialand theme park where all the students had a fantastic day and coped admirably in the 30-degree heat!

On the third day, we visited Cochem, for shopping, lunch and a tour of the stunning fairy tale like castle on the hill. Students were able to practise their German skills ordering drinks and ice-creams!

The students behaved impeccably, and this was commented on by several members of the public on the ferry.







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This year's Duke of Edinburgh Award trips review

We have just returned home after a successful 4-day Gold expedition in the Yorkshire Dales and Cumbria. 28 fantastic year 12 students took part in the experience, walking from Buxton to Kirkby Stephen, and camping in Hawes, Dent and the Howgill Fells. Over the 4 days, students demonstrated grit and determination to get to the end - a huge achievement-Well done to all who took part.

At the start of the month, we completed the Bronze expedition season; 165 year 10 students took part and were split into 3 expedition cohorts. Each took part in a practice expedition and assessed expedition. These expeditions took place fairly locally in the Dales. The students did incredibly well over the two weekends to complete the expedition section. Now with the expedition section complete, students must turn their attention to the other 3 sections- Physical, Volunteering and Skill (plus Residential at Gold level). Each of these sections encourage organisation and time management to set up, plus commitment to see through. I encourage any student needing support to get in touch and ask for help.
