Year 7 Welcome and Key Information

It is a pleasure to welcome our new Year 7 cohort.

Routines and Expectations

We have high expectations of all of our students. Full details of the routines and expectations can be found in the <u>parent handbook</u>. We expect high levels of attendance throughout the year and will contact you if there is an unexplained absence. We monitor attendance trends closely and will put supportive measures in place if necessary. Routine medical and dental appointments should be made outside school time where possible. The NHS have given <u>guidance</u> if you are unsure whether to send your child to school, please <u>click here</u> for instructions how to report any absence.

Students must wear their uniform correctly and with pride; shirts need to be tucked in and shoes, not trainers or trainer styles, need to be worn. We do not allow makeup, and this includes fake eyelashes, false or painted nails or body/facial piercings. If students have these for an event or special occasion, please ensure that they have been removed in readiness for school. Your support in this is very much appreciated.

We continue to focus on <u>Learner Habits</u>. These are habits that learners need to exhibit to ensure they build a strong work ethic and achieve the very best outcomes for themselves. Students will be awarded positive behaviour points on Class Charts if these habits are displayed and there are rewards for reaching milestones in the number of positive points. If students are not meeting expectations in the classroom or the wider school, students will receive a negative behaviour point. We will be monitoring these closely and making contact with you. As part of our HGS values, we have high expectations of students being respectful to themselves, to others and to the environment. All students have signed a <u>Respect Pledge</u> at the start of the year, agreeing to follow respectful behaviours. Frequency and Duration of Home Learning

Throughout the year we will talk with students about the importance of work ethic. We are encouraging students to set themselves clear goals and to take pride in their work. We want students at HGS to work hard, and to push themselves out of their comfort zone. Home learning is a perfect opportunity for this to ensure they are being the best version of themselves to get the best outcomes for their future.

Reading

We are once again very fortunate to be supported by our PTA who have funded the purchase of books for our new year 7 cohort. This means that by the end of the summer all students will have read the same book as part of their transition to HGS. Reading is of great importance, and we ask that you support us by helping and encouraging your child to read for 30 minutes each day at home. All the research shows that this will not only support your child's education and development, but also their mental health and well-being.

Voluntary Contributions

To help support school finances and allow us to provide that little bit extra at HGS, we do ask for a number of voluntary contributions. We politely ask for a voluntary contribution of £20 for every year 7 student. We do ask for further contributions throughout the year for extras such as PE extra-curricular clubs and fixtures, to provide additional materials in Art and Design and for curriculum-based school trips.
