

Headphones

(Year 7 and Year 12 students new to HGS)

For music and language lessons, you need to bring in a set of headphones which have a mini jack adapter on them so you can plug these into a desktop computer and with some of the instruments (e.g. electronic keyboards).





Students will also need an adapter to use your headphones with your new iPad as this does not have a headphone socket. Opposite is an example of the USB-C adaptor you will need, which can be purchased at a very low cost from many online retailers.

Lockers

Reporting Absence in Years 7 to 11 Introducing a New System

We are pleased to announce that we are introducing a new, more efficient and secure system for reporting if your child will be absent from school due to illness. This new system is called Studybugs.

Please download the free Studybugs app, or you can register on the <u>Studybugs website</u>. Use this new app to advise when your child is ill and unable to attend school. Absences should be reported to school by 9.30am each morning.

Why use Studybugs?

- Studybugs app is integrated with our MI system, Arbor, so we know straight away if your child will not be in school.
- It is quick and easy to use. The app is free, and registration only takes a minute to complete. The app prompts you to keep us posted about how your child is feeling.





Park and Stride

Keeping Our Children Safe

After congestion on Arthur's Avenue this week, please can we remind you of the <u>Park and Stride</u> safe drop-off zones. We would encourage you to use them as an alternative to driving up Arthurs Avenue at these very busy times. We ask that you do not stop on the zig zags and double yellow lines outside school. We would like to remind parents that Cundall Way, Southway, Grasmere Crescent and Rossett Way are Access Only and as such parking is not permitted. Please do not park in the main car park at drop off and pick up times as buses are trying to drop off and collect students. Your co-operation is very much appreciated.

Parents are encouraged to use the main car park when collecting students from after school extra-curricular activities. At this time, school buses have departed so the car park is much quieter. We would ask that you switch off car engines if you are waiting for your child.
