Dear Student and Parent/Carer

Bronze Duke of Edinburgh - Year 10

I write to inform you about an exciting opportunity for Year 10 students. The Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) Award is an extra-curricular award scheme aimed at 13-24 year olds. It is designed to develop new skills, improve fitness, provide an opportunity to volunteer and a chance to develop lasting friendships and memories. At HGS we offer the Bronze award to Year 10 students and the Gold award to Year 12 and 13 students.

How it works

It will usually take between 6 and 12 months to complete the Bronze programme.

The Bronze award is split into 4 sections

Volunteering section: 3 months
 Physical section: 3 months

Skills section: 3 months

• Expedition section: 2 days/1 night

 You also have to spend an extra three months on one of the Volunteering, Physical or Skills sections.

Activities for each DofE section take a minimum of **one hour a week** over a set period of time, so they can be fitted in around academic study, hobbies and social lives. Development and regular progress must be shown, and all activities must be completed by the participant's 25th birthday, however we encourage students to finish their Bronze award by the end of Year 10.

Expedition section

For the expedition section we work in collaboration with a local provider, Lupine Adventure (https://www.lupineadventure.co.uk/). With expected high numbers of participants, we plan to split the cohort in half and run expedition events on the following dates:

- Saturday 10 Sunday 11 May 2025 Cohort 1 Practice expedition
- Saturday 17 Sunday 18 May 2025 Cohort 1 Assessed expedition
- Saturday 7 Sunday 8 June 2025 Cohort 2 Practice expedition
- Saturday 14 Sunday 15 June 2025 Cohort 2 Assessed expedition
- Saturday 28 Sunday 29 June 2025 Cohort 3 Practice expedition
- Saturday 5 Sunday 6 July 2025 Cohort 3 Assessed expedition

For the practice expedition, each expedition group will be trained and supported by a qualified instructor who delivers the necessary expedition training in preparation for the assessed expedition. Both practice and assessed expeditions are 2 days/1 night. Students will camp in tents at local campsites. Students will need to be dropped off and collected by parents at designated points at the start and end of the expedition – details to follow

In school training

To cover all the pre-expedition training and planning there will be 3 after school sessions (details to follow). It is important that participating students attend these training events.

Route	Cost	Details	
Registration and welcome pack	£28	This is non-refundable. Once registered on the award, students will receive a welcome pack through the post. This contains important information about the award including a 'keeping track book' that they use to record their assessor reports.	
		If students don't complete the award during their time at HGS, their account remains active, and they have until their 25 th birthday to complete the award.	
Expedition	£237	This includes the events mentioned above.	
		Students that complete all 4 sections will achieve certificates for each section and a badge to recognise their achievement.	
Licence fee	£20.50	HGS pays for the licence to deliver the DofE award. This is a contribution to that fee.	
Equipment	£4.50	This is for equipment that is borrowed from HGS. This allows us to purchase/repair necessary equipment that can be lent to students. This includes gas, stoves and tents

What is the DofE?




The DofE is a life-changing adventure you don't want to miss.

It's about going the extra mile – learning new skills for work and life, getting fitter, helping others and exploring the countryside.



If you're interested in a specific field, this could be the perfect chance to do something related to it. If you're interested in photography, for example, you could do that as your skill.


You'll grow in confidence and get a real sense of achievement.

Additional costs:

Kit: you may need to buy/borrow walking boots, sleeping bag and waterproof jacket and trousers. All technical kit such as maps, compasses, tents and stoves can be borrowed from school.

In school training

You will be organised into expedition groups and receive in school training afterschool on Mondays or Thursdays between January and March

- Introduction and registration
- First aid
- Meal planning
- Navigation training
- Expedition planning- Route cards and maps
